

Hello and welcome to the One Piece editor test! In this test you will be tried for:

- Editing prowess.
- Autodidacticism capability. (A.k.a. ability to find out things for yourself, independency.)
- Ambition.

Before starting, you're gonna need some tools. I will list the most obvious ones first, and then you'll have to figure out the rest in order to pass the test:

- Internet connection.
- Any editing software (Except Camtasia and Windows Movie Maker).
- One Piece music tracks. You can download the tracks from our site <http://onepiecetracklist.com> or from an anime torrenting site.

Alright, let's begin!

First, torrent the raw One Piece episode that you will be editing. Then, open it up in your editing software and edit it to your liking, basically cutting out fillers and padding just like One Piece, making use of resources like the music tracks and sound effects to make edits as seamless as possible. In your edit you will be judged based on (Listed in priority):

- Seamless edits. Jarring cuts can break the viewer's immersion.
- Pacing. Too fast and the viewer gets no breathing room to consume the information. Too slow and the viewer becomes bored and loses attention.
- Canonicity. We will be comparing your edit to the corresponding manga chapters and see how they match up.

When you're finished, render your project and slap some subtitles on your video. We won't be judging you on your timing abilities, it's just to help us understand the lines. If you're not sure where to start, take a look at this [timing manual](#). Subs can be grabbed from HorribleSubs/yibis/whatever. When you've muxed it all together, join our [discord](#) and PM either @Galaxy9000 or @Simon and send us your file, and we'll judge you based on the list above. After that, we'll be asking a few questions (to clear up the ambition part).
